



Figure 1: Registration Detail

#### Inauguration ceremony and best wishes from Trustee of Vidyabharti Trust



Session 1: Dr. MD Salahuddin (Principal, Al ameen College of Pharmacy, Bangalore)



Session 2: Dr. Sanjay Chauhan (Director, Graduate school of Pharmacy, Gandhinagar)



Session 3: Dr. Ravi Manek (Assistant professor, B. K. Mody Government Pharmacy College, Rajkot)





#### Session 5: Dr. Himanshu Makvana (R&D manager, Phyto Life science Pvt Ltd)








Figure 2: Feedback response chart for webinar.
